

After Surgery: How to Care for Your Pet

Your pet has had major surgery and will need to be well cared-for afterwards to help prevent complications. Following the instructions below will help ensure your pet has a safe and comfortable recovery.

1. Limit Activity

Pets must be kept indoors where they can stay clean, dry, and warm. Feral cats need to stay in a shelter for 48hrs. NO running or jumping for 10 days.

2. <u>Diet</u>

Your pet's appetite should return gradually within 24 hours. Give your pet a ½ size meal for their evening meal. Puppies and kittens may have an <u>additional small meals</u> if not vomiting. Water should always be available.

3. Keep the Incision Dry

No bathing for 10 days. Do NOT allow pet to lick at incision site. Licking is the #1 surgical complication. Keep the e-collar on.

4. Check Their Incision Twice Daily

Monitor for swelling, redness, wetness, and good closure of skin

5. Keep In-Heat Females Away From Males

Hormones will persists for up to 4 weeks after surgery

6. Look Out for Complications
